ANNUAL SCHOLARSHIP

To All Parents; Program Directors; Coaches; CTF Sanctioned Bowlers in the London and District Youth Program.

The Board of Directors of the London and District Ten Pin Bowling Association has established an annual scholarship fund for the awarding of one or more scholarships per year to sanctioned CTF bowlers in the London District. This was the 20th year that this scholarship award has been offered. Since the inception of this fund, \$32,750.00 has been awarded to our youth bowlers. We thank all of the program directors and coaches for their assistance in completing the forms this year.

The program directors and league coaches in each house have received copies of the forms that are to be used. The forms are included in each league kit that is sent out to the program directors at the start of each season. The forms are available to any sanctioned bowler or parent at any time from any of the scholarship committee, or any Board Director. Their names and phone numbers can be found in the beginning of this yearbook.

If you are aware of any sanctioned youth bowler in the London and area that you believe should be nominated for this scholarship please approach the program director of that bowling centre, or if you wish a scholarship committee member listed at the bottom of this page. We will see to it that the forms are provided to that bowler and that the bowler knows what has to be done with them.

The criteria for the awarding of this scholarship are based on neither bowling prowess nor scholastic ability. The exact criteria are laid out in the forms that are provided. There is a section to be completed by the youth bowler and also the bowler's coach or program director.

A very strict time frame must be adhered to. The completed paperwork must be in the hands of the Association Manager of the CTF Local Association by midnight on or before February 16th. His name and address can be found in the white pages of this yearbook. Any applications that are not received by this time by the Association Manager will not be considered under any circumstances. There will not be any extensions of time granted.

Also, if you are aware of anyone that would be willing to make a donation to this scholarship fund please feel free to contact one of the scholarship committee members at any time.

We strongly encourage all sanctioned youth bowlers in the London and District to apply for this scholarship. While a bowler may only be awarded the scholarship once, that bowler may apply for the scholarship as long as they remain in the youth program.

The members of the London and District Ten Pin Bowling Association congratulate all past winners of this scholarship and look forward to the awarding of many future scholarships.

Guidelines for the London and District Ten Pin Bowling Associations's Annual Scholarship

<u>Purpose:</u> To provide one (1) or more scholarships annually to one (1) or more sanctioned youth Bowler(s) in the London and District Ten Pin Bowling Association. The number of scholarships awarded yearly is to be left to the discretion of the scholarship committee.

Scholarship Committee: The scholarship committee will be appointed annually by the president of the Lodon and District Ten Pin Bowling Association (L.D.T.P.B.A.). The committee will consist of a chairperson and two committee members. To be appointed to his committee the directors must not have a youth bowler enrolled in the local Youth program of the London and District Ten Pin Bowling Association, and/ or be a program director or coach. This is to ensure that there is no conflict of interest.

<u>Funds:</u> A separate account will be maintained and used only for scholarship money. Each year the Scholarship Committee will decide on the number and the value of the scholarship(s). All monies approved by the board of directors for the annual scholarship will be deposited into this account by the end of the fiscal year.

Any and all interest gained on the money in this account will remain in this account and are not payable to the individuals receiving the scholarships. Unused monies are to remain in this account. Any interest and unused monies will be used in years that funds may not be available from the association and/or to top up a particular year's scholarship(s) award.

Any monies that may come from outside sources and that the donor asks this association to provide for in our scholarship fund to any of our sanctioned bowlers will be accepted. Any and all interest that is gained on this money will remain in this account to be used as described above. No monies will be paid out of this account for administrative fees. All monies will be used to provide scholarships only.

<u>Policy for Nominating Bowlers for this Scholarship:</u> To be eligible to be considered for this scholarship the following criteria must apply:

- 1. The bowler must be a fully paid, sanctioned member in good standing of the . L.D.T.P.B.A. Youth program for the year of nomination.
- 2. The bowler nominated must have demonstrated a willingness to help and/or provide leadership to other bowlers and/or coaches.
- 3. The bowler nominated must demonstrate good sportsmanship: i.e. not being abusive to the bowling centre's equipment; as gracious in defeat as in winning, etc.
- 4. Individual traits/characteristics that distinguish this bowler as an asset to the program in that house.
- 5. Have an interest in further education at the time of nomination.
- 6. Both the coach that is nominating the bowler and the bowler must sign the application.
- 7. The bowler must submit a few sentences explaining in their own words why they feel that they should be considered for the scholarship. These comments will be considered by the committee as part of their evaluation of the bowler's credentials for being awarded a scholarship.

Other Areas for Consideration for Nominating:

- 1. Average will <u>not</u> be a determining factor.
- 2. Grades will <u>not</u> be a determining factor.
- 3. Need will <u>not</u> be a determining factor.
- 4. Bowlers do not have to be a sanctioned member at the time that the scholarship funds are used. The bowler must not be under suspension from CTF at the time the funds are drawn. If the bowler is under suspension at the time that the funds are requested, the funds will be held in trust until such time as the suspension is lifted and/or the bowler's eligibility deadline is reached.
- Only one scholarship per bowler per lifetime from this Association will be allowed.
- 6. The money will remain in the scholarship fund until the bowler utilizes the fund and/or reached the end of the eligibility limit. Once the bowler reaches the eligibility limit the unused funds will remain in the scholarship account and be used as described above.
- 7. Age of the bowler at the time of nomination and awarding of the scholarship will not be a determining factor.
- 8. The L.D.T.P.B.A. reserves the right to amend the guidelines for awarding a scholarship upon annual review. The conditions that the bowler was awarded a scholarship will not change.
- 9. The L.D.T.P.B.A. will reserve the option of continuing this scholarship program. It can be canceled at anytime in the future and/or restarted again by the normal Board of Directors' voting procedure. Once a scholarship has been awarded it will not be rescinded, as the funds are to be placed in a separate account for this purpose only. If in the future the Board of Directors decides that the scholarship program will not be continued, the majority of the monies that are in our scholarship fund are to be awarded in one or more final scholarship(s), and the balance that is not used is to be transferred to the Association's general account. The amount to be transferred will be a very minimal amount, as the intent of this fund is to be awarding of scholarships, not to be a profit making venture for this Association. The above noted minimal amounts are only to be sufficient funds as is required to close the account and cover such expenses, but not limited to, the cost of service charges that are required to process cheques, etc.
- 10. It is the bowler sole responsibility to keep the L.D.T.P.B.A. informed of their current address and phone number. It is also the bowler's sole responsibility to provide proof of date of graduation from high school, etc. to the L.D.T.P.B.A. in order to ensure proper administration of funds.

<u>Uses of Scholarship Funds</u>: The recipients can use the scholarship funds to finance tuition fees; housing fees (on campus only); meal plans (on campus only); book related to their studies; select class supplies and equipment as related to their studies while enrolled at the following educational institutions.

- 1. Accredited universities, colleges and business schools.
- 2. Bowling camps
- 3. Continuing education classes
- 4. Educational camps such as: math, science, art, and computers.
- 5. Professional development seminars or workshops.
- 6. Technical schools.
- 7. Trade schools

8. Vocational schools, i.e.: including such courses as, but not necessarily limited to dealer; bartending, or if in doubt please contact the scholarship committee at least two months prior to enrollment to allow us to make a decision. The schools must be located in Canada or the United States.

We reserve the right to approve all scholarship uses and educational institutions and all decisions are final.

Scholarship funds are available to the recipients up to five (5) chronological years after their high school graduation or date of military discharge – which ever comes later. There will be no extensions, and scholarships are non-transferable. When a scholarship expires, the unused funds revert back to the scholarship fund to be used as previously described.

Other uses of the scholarship funds may be requested by the recipient, but such requests must not be in direct conflict of any of the established guidelines.

How to Receive a Scholarship Cheque:

Requests must be made in writing – as a detailed or itemized invoice – and payment will only be made to the educational institute. Under special circumstances funds can be payable to the recipient, but must first be authorized by the committee then must be properly documented and invoiced to be considered for direct payment. Direct payment should be requested prior to an actual requirement, but not less then 30 (thirty) days.

Requests must include the following:

- 1. Scholarship recipient's name
- 2. Educational institutions or acceptable organization's full name, address, city, province (state), postal code (zip code) and phone number.
- 3. Registered course or program names.
- 4. Scholarship amount requested, not to exceed the maximum amount awarded to the recipient.
- 5. Mailing address if different from the institution.
- 6. Official enrollment verification.
- 7. Original receipts unless otherwise authorized.

Requests for funds must be made at least one month prior to actually being required.

The recipient, and/or the parents or legal guardians if the recipient is not of legal age, will be required to sign a binding agreement that the guidelines will be followed. Failure to do so at the time of awarding the scholarship, the scholarship will not be awarded to that bowler and the London and District Ten Pin Bowling Association will not be held responsible for withdrawing its offer of the scholarship.
