After 3 days, the tournament cut the field to the top 18 men and top 12 women. Felicia, averaging 205.3, led the tournament and was accompanied by fellow FTA member **Miranda Fisher** and Albertan **Samantha How** into the top 12 and one more day of competition.



Day 4 saw another cut – to the top 6, who would make team Canada, with the top 3 fighting it out in a step ladder for the title of Canadian Champion. Felicia finished the event in 2nd spot, and would face **Isabelle Rioux** in a one-game match, with the winner to challenge top spot **Miranda Panas**. Felicia bested Isabelle 258 to 235, earning the right to go up against Miranda and needing two victories against her to claim the Canadian crown. Felicia struck out in the 10th frame to win game one 227 to 225. In game two, a winner take all match, Felicia was not to be denied and her 258 bested Miranda's 181, giving Felicia her first National title.

For those of you who may not be aware of this adventure...

Bob Puttick, a CTF Hall-of-Famer, and an extraordinary person, set out on a long (and I mean LONG) bicycle trip to do some fundraising for the Alberta Children's Hospital, Toronto Sick Kids Hospital, and for the Youth Bowling program at the Let's Bowl centre in Calgary.

His plans were to ride from the doors of Let's Bowl in Calgary (picture at left), to the doors of Leisure Lanes in Oshawa, Ontario.

This is an excerpt from one of Bob's posts on Facebook while he was in the middle of his ride:

"I am enjoying the 'alone time' while I ride. I talk to the prairie dogs, geese, ducks, horses, and cows, think about a lot of things, and stop when I need to. The bullfrog noise is fabulous! Still don't know if I can do this, but without trying I'll never know. I need 2 more weeks to convince myself, then maybe I will get that "eureka" moment, that I can & will finish."

Unfortunately, after 26 days and almost 1400 kms, Bob had to stop his adventure. When he reached Manitoba, he decided to cut down south to North Dakota, where a state trooper stopped him, because he wasn't allowed to ride his bike in the state. And he learned that the same was true for Minnesota. So, he ended up finishing the trip via Amtrak and an airplane to Toronto. A valiant effort, for a very worthwhile cause, was ended prematurely.

However, as Bob always does, he made the best of the situation. And his family helped too. His granddaughter (Angela Bockman), upon learning of Bob's situation, created an additional fundraiser, by getting pledges based on the number of strikes she would throw over 7 weeks in her league. Between Bob, his family, and with the help of Leisure Lanes, and the bowling community across the country, over \$6,000 was raised and donated to these worthy organizations.

We are told that the money that was raised far outweighed his disappointment of not finishing the trip by cycle.

Hamilton's final 2017 – 2018 total is 21 perfect games, seven games of 299, one 296 game, five games of 290 and 11 triples of 800 or better. With two 300 games were **Mick Anderer, Ryan Dickenson, Art Oliver Jr., Rob May and Len Garinger Jr.** With one 300 game were **Travis Cauley, Doug Schatz, Bill Hicks, Matt Lewis, Josh Colwell, Brian Ward, Nick Murphy, Matt Havens, Aaron Bouchard**, and one week after **Mike Smith** rolled his 300, his father **Ron** rolled his 300.

Missing perfection by one pin with 299's were **Matt Lewis, Richard Parker, Bill Craig, Mike Scargall, Steve Smith, Ron Machida, Aaron Bouchard & Art Oliver Jr.** The 296 game was recorded by **Ryan Dickenson** and with 290 games were **Matt Lewis, Bruce Tyler, Richard Parker, Kevin Kartonchik & Fred Renaud.** Eleven strikes in a row for 279's were dealt by **Steve Ferguson, Jeff Easton & Conrad Merkir** while **Tim LaCroix** had 11 in a row for a 277 game.

The eleven 800 triples ranged from **Art Oliver Jr.**'s 823 to **Ryan Dickenson** & that Oliver guy again with even 800's. The other eight were fired by **Josh Colwell** 813, **Scott Tarbut** 812, **Steve Smith** 809, **Steve Smith** 806, **Len Garinger Jr. & Billy Craig** 804, **Kevin Kartonchik** 803 and **Chris King** 802.

Art Oliver Jr. continues to led the Hamilton honour score list as he now has 24 perfect games, eight 299 games, a pair of 298's and 12 triples of 800 or better for an overall total of 46 honour scores. **Travis Cauley** is second with 20 perfect games, six games of 299, a pair of 298's and seven triples of 800 or better for 35 honour scores. In third is **Lionel Lewis Jr.** with 27, fourth **Aaron Bouchard** at 24 and fifth **Chris King** at 22.

North America's oldest sanctioned league at 115 years, the City Tenpin at Skyway Lanes has crowned its champions. Top team was composed of **Mark Andrews, Shawwna Prieur, Pete Haveman & Mick Anderer** with **Mark Ward, John Cooper, Aleta Manning & Steve Cowie** second. Anderer had high average at 222 along with a 300 game. **Kevin Kartonchik's** 803 was high triple. This season saw two women compete for the first time with Prieur at 198 and Manning at 197.

High average in the Veterans Service League went to **Mike Ellis** at 202 with **Ed Margueratt** next at an even 200. On the last night of the season, **Jim Margueratt** spared the unusual 3 – 5 – 7 split. Another Hamilton bowling house is scheduled to close if the Hamilton Light Rapid Transit goes ahead. It has been on King Street for over 50 years and I remember bowling five pins there during my high school years.

At the C.T.F. Nationals in Mississauga, **Doug Schatz** qualified for the Canadian Seniors team and **Art Oliver Jr.** had the first 10 strikes for a 289 game. At the Ontario Provincial Tenpin Bowling Association Annual meeting in Burlington, in attendance were CTF President **Brian McMaster** and CTF Executive Director **Cathy Innes** who stopped off on her way home from Ottawa.

A new form of bowling was on display at Bowl Expo 2018 in Las Vegas. It is Hyper Bowling and was described as "pinball bowling." You aim for flashing lights on the bumpers and depending on what lights you hit and how many pins you knock down, gives you a score. It was different watching Bowler of the Year **Jason Belmonte** aiming for the "bumpers", instead of the head pin. He was good at this also as he won the mini tournament.



HAMILTON TENPIN TRIVIA:

- Since opening in 1957, Skyway Lanes has seen 222 perfect games. In the 24 years from 1957 to 1981, there were none. Since then in the next 37 years there were 222.
- The top three record Hamilton triples for the men are, **Bill Rowe Jr.** 852, **Art Oliver Jr.** 848 and **Richard Parker & Lionel Lewis Jr.** tied at 838. The top three women are **Sioban Ryans** 846, **Catharine Rowe** 795 & tied at 770 **Laura Wilmer & Nadine Hamilton**.
- The six Hamilton & District Lanes for next season are Skyway Lanes, Burlington Bowl, University Lanes, Star Lanes and the two Splitsville houses in Hamilton & Burlington.
- When **Jeff Lofft** rolled three 300 games in 2008, each time another 300 was rolled by **Tom Johnston, William Russell & Matt Lewis** on the same night.
- When **Al Tone** won \$250 he became the first Hamilton bowler to cash on the PBA tour. It was in New Jersey and Al averaged 225 & finished 34th.
- **Mark Jackson** improved by one pin each game in 1995 for a 257, 258, 259 triplicate.

Our 6th Annual CITY OF ROSES Pre-Season Tournament is not far off. We would like to extend an invitation to all Ontario C.T.F. Adult members to come out and support this event. This tournament will be a great way to get ready for the upcoming bowling season.

This year there will be prizes for high handicap games for both men and women. To try and boost pre-paid entries the tournament organizers have implemented a pre-paid entry draw to encourage bowlers to register in advance. Having pre-paid entries helps the tournament directors better organize the squads. Last year this tournament paid out over \$5,000 in prize money.

City of Roses tournament is offering events for Teams, Doubles, and Singles with Men's, Women's and Mixed divisions. The tournament is scheduled for August 11 and August 12, 2018 with squads at 10 a.m., 1:30pm and 5p.m. on both days. Bowlers must be at least 19 years of age to participate. It is C.T.F. sanctioned. The tournament is 100% handicap. Revs Rose Bowl, at 2482 Dougall Avenue, Windsor Ontario, is hosting the event. Entries will close ½ hour before each squad. The entry fee is Teams - \$100, Doubles - \$50, and Singles - \$25. Bowlers can wait to pay when they check in. Tournament will be holding brackets, 50/50 draw, and ball raffles.

You can mail, email, or fill in an on-line entry form from the WECKBA web site. In the TEAM EVENT 4 bowlers bowl 4 games with handicap then the lowest team score is dropped. In the DOUBLES EVENT, bowlers roll 4 games with the lowest combined score (scratch and handicap) dropped. In the SINGLES EVENT, you bowl 4 games and eliminate the lowest scratch game and handicap. In Teams, Doubles, and Singles events, three games total with handicap determines the winners. You can reach the Tournament Directors using the following contact information:

Youth Tenpin Program is 40 Years young

The fortieth year of youth tenpin bowling in Thunder Bay concluded with the newly crowned Bowler of the Year and a special recognition to one of the bowlers.

Kaylee Hofer, at her first CTF National Youth Championships won a silver medal in the singles event to claim this year's CTF (Thunder Bay) Bowler of the Year trophy. The YBC (Thunder Bay) Bowler of the Year went to **Daytona Shaffer** based on her achievements at the YBC Nationals. She owns 7 Provincial medals and one Provincial Gold medal. At the past YBC Nationals, she posted a record high game for the junior girls with a 267.

The Special Recognition Award was presented to the program's outstanding bowler, **Aaron Craig**. He has spent the last ten years honing his sport to a point where he is one of the top tenpinners in Thunder Bay. He has bowled four perfect games and hit the bowler's dream score of over 800 for three games this past season. He has won six CTF National medals and two YBC National medals including a Gold in each. In August he will be in Florida, representing Canada, at the Tournament of the Americas as the adult male representative from Canada.

CROSS COUNTRY CANADIAN NEWS



The program started back in the fall of 1978 by **Brian McLean** and **Richard Queniville** with fifteen bowlers at Galaxy Lanes. The bowlers at that time were sanctioned only with the Young American Bowling Association. When Queneville left the city, **Perry Hampel** joined McLean the following year, and they joined the YBC and produced their first Provincial Champion, **Terry Matson**. Matson is now a member of the Mario's senior program.

By 1982, the youth membership had increased to over 80 members. Galaxy Lanes was too small for the bowlers and **Mario Martinuzzi**, who was remodeling after a fire, offered to put in thirty lanes, if the youth would bowl at his place. In 1983, the youth tenpinners moved, and has been at Mario's for the past 35 years. Over the past 40 years, the youth program has hosted two YBC and two CTF National Championships.

In 1983, Hampel and McLean were instrumental in getting their bowlers to the very first National Championships for YABA-sanctioned bowlers, in Winnipeg. These YABA championships was the forerunner to the current CTF Nationals. **Tammy Youmans, Kelly Graham, Janne Sorri, Debbie Fuchek, Stephen Phillips** and **Shane Zellweger** represented Ontario and came home with 15 National Medals; 3 Gold, 4 Silvers and 8 Bronze. Since that time, bowlers from Mario's have accumulated 43 CTF Golds, 33 Silver and 57 bronze medals.

McLean has seen many of the youth bowlers over the past forty years graduating from the youth ranks to becoming top adult bowlers such as **Bill Graham, Andrew Hill, Ken Martyn, Michael Makela, Ian Nakonechny, Diana Nakonechny** and **Lyndzie Dawson-Guay**, to name a few. One past graduate is the current bowling manager at Mario's, Bill Graham.

This instructional and fun program is for boys and girls between the ages of 5 and 21 with NCCP-certified coaches. The Mario's Youth Tenpin program, a sanctioned bowling program with the Canadian Tenpin Federation, is divided into five age groups, namely, the PEEWEES who age up to 8 years old; BANTAMS are nine to eleven; JUNIORS are 12 to 14; INTERMEDIATES are 15, 16 and 17 and the SENIORS who are 18 to 21 year olds. The program also has membership in Youth Bowling Canada (YBC). Co-ed Teams are made up with bowlers within their own age division. Bowling runs from September to April with fun tournaments throughout the season.




Canadian Team Trials




